- 1. Welcome, introductions, and topics overview
 - a. Meeting focus: review and update WSMA festivals rules and suggestions for brevity, clarity, and accessibility
 - b. WSMA board to review festivals committee decisions at semi-annual meeting next week
- 2. Concert festival rules
 - a. Clinic experience to subsume traditional clinic performance assessment, alternative clinic performance assessment, and informance options to encourage increased participation by allowing for encompassed flexibility
 - b. WSMA member school ensembles will have only two options to fulfill requirement, both of which must be registered with WSMA:
 - i. WSMA-sanctioned concert festival
 - ii. Conductor-organized clinic experience
 - 1. No longer required to partner with another group or group of same type
 - 2. No longer required to fulfill listening component by critiquing another physically-present group
 - 3. No longer required to perform literature from WSMA festival music list
 - c. Clarified language explaining required registrations from one representative of each type of concert ensemble from singular member school
 - d. Festivals committee wishes to maintain submission of comment-only evaluation forms requirement to verify completion of clinic experience

- e. Festivals committee supports option to pay registration fees at time of WSMA membership enrollment (payment of annual dues) to assist with educators' budget planning
- 3. Eligibility rules
 - a. Original school eligibility requirements for participation in WSMA programs remain valid in 2016-2017 school year
 - b. WSMA accreditation option replaces school eligibility rules beyond paid WSMA membership in 2017-2018 school year
 - i. Festivals committee prefers gradual rollout of achievable standards in beginning year(s)
 - ii. Festivals committee willing to support pilot
 - iii. Standards and process yet to be defined (e.g. consideration of tiered structure and application process)
 - 1. WSMA-proposed base-level accreditation standards:
 - a. School must be current WSMA member
 - b. School must participate in WSMA district solo and ensemble festival
 - c. One of each concert group type (band/choir/orchestra) in school must participate in concert festival or clinic experience annually
 - iv. Branding and marketing campaign yet to be defined
 - v. WSMA staff to develop fleshed out single- and multi-tier accreditation plan proposals internally and share with appropriate parties for approval
 - 1. Festivals committee email in fall 2016
 - 2. WSMA board semi-annual meeting in December 2016
- 4. Event rules
 - a. 5918 (household items and body percussion) wording update approved
 - i. "Compositions primarily written for household items and body percussion are not permitted."
 - b. 5833 (multiple entries) rule addition approved
 - i. "Individual students may enter this event more than once as long as the number and/or combinations of instruments differs for each entry."
 - c. 1311 and 1321 (musical theatre) review
 - i. Festivals committee upholds simultaneous class A classical solo event entry requirement
- 5. Permissions process
 - a. Festivals committee approves one-school year term of granted permissions, as long as instrumentation does not change
 - b. Festivals committee condones removal of student name request, as long as instrumentation does not change

- 6. Adjudicator compensation
 - a. School districts increasingly struggle to pay on time, due to various legal, procedural, and financial hurdles
 - b. Festivals committee suggests that WSMA develops and provides printed payment guidelines for festival and/or business managers in advance of festivals
- 7. Accompanist rule
 - a. Accompanists often play more than maximum number of events allowed (15) at single district or state solo and ensemble festival
 - b. Festivals committee recommends changing maximum number to suggested number for district solo and ensemble festival
 - c. Festivals committee recommends maintaining maximum number for state solo and ensemble festival
- 8. Four-week registration deadline
 - a. Only 35% of subsidy checks mailed before district solo and ensemble festivals in 2015-2016 school year
 - b. Festivals committee requests that WSMA shares unpaid schools with festival managers before festival
- 9. Exemplary soloist process
 - a. Continued large numbers of nominations and selections, wide variation in adjudicator selection, and imperfect results verification
 - i. Approximately 8% of soloists nominated in 2016
 - ii. Approximately 5% of soloists selected in 2016
 - b. Festivals committee classifies "exemplary" as top 3% to 1% of soloists
 - i. Scale back range of nominations possible (six maximum)
 - ii. Scale back range of selections possible (two maximum)
 - c. Festivals committee requests nomination notifications delayed until official final results and selections posted
- 10. Piano students versus other private studio students
 - a. Current rule: "At the discretion of the member school, piano students who are not members of a regularly scheduled school music performing ensemble may participate in a WSMA District Solo & Ensemble Festival. It is recommended that the student be asked to accompany at least one solo or ensemble event."
 - b. Exclusive of other private studio students
 - c. Festivals committee wishes to table issue until next meeting
- 11. New festivals committee members
 - a. Festivals committee to experience turnover in 2016-2017 school year
 - b. Submit new member suggestions to Shelley
- 12. Next school year's meeting dates
