- 1. Welcome & introductions
 - a. New festivals committee member: Darin Schmidt, vocal music director from Luther L. Wright High and Middle Schools in Ironwood, Michigan
- 2. Items from last meeting
 - a. New contemporary string ensemble event updates
 - i. List selection to be scheduled
 - ii. Festivals committee members Sarah Hafenstein and Cynthia Kiepert volunteered to assist with list selection
 - b. New jazz transcribed solo event updates
 - i. List selection is in process
 - ii. Matt Buchman, David Dunning and Bill Dennee are assisting with list selection
 - iii. Rollout is anticipated for fall 2022
 - c. Suggested repertoire for changing/transitioning voice event (1231) in class C
 - i. Offering only standard repertoire could be too limiting
 - ii. Festivals committee approves offering list of suggested repertoire sourced from previously-approved submissions for permission
 - d. Event number revisions
 - i. Some teachers have suggested moving events in 6000s to their respective event family sections (e.g., show choir event moves to 1000s)
 - 1. WSMA created sample draft to reflect this scenario
 - a. Pro: revision requires few changes
 - b. Con: jazz events must be wedged illogically into existing event numbers
 - ii. Festival committee members have suggested reworking entire list
 - 1. Pro: opportunity to improve upon ordering logic and other issues

- 2. Con: requires large volume of time-consuming work with potentially unsettling side effects for teachers accustomed to current ordering logic, especially during pandemic teaching
- iii. Festivals committee maintains that reworking entire list is still worth consideration but recommends revisiting this topic at next meeting
 - 1. Earliest rollout possibility is fall 2023
 - 2. Teachers would likely appreciate announcement of revisions nine months prior to rollout
- 3. New items from teacher inquiries
 - a. Substitution of mallet station for mallet instruments
 - i. Festivals committee approves mallet station use to allow students unable to access appropriate mallet instrument to perform
 - b. Miscellaneous vocal ensemble event (1918) transfers
 - i. Does event 1918 header mistakenly omit middle school choir class M event 1030 and madrigal events 1519 and 1529 from list of nontransferable events?
 - 1. Festivals committee does not approve revision of event 1918 header but recommends:
 - a. Middle school choir teachers use repertoire intended for small ensembles instead of trying to apply large group repertoire to breakout ensembles
 - b. Creating madrigal event for nonstandard voicing
 - c. TTB/B vocal jazz
 - i. Request for TTB/B vocal jazz entry but no matching event currently exists
 - ii. Festivals committee approves registering entry under SSA/A vocal jazz event and requesting permission to transfer
 - iii. Festivals committee supports exploring addition of TTB/B vocal jazz event
 - d. Adult conductors in miscellaneous vocal ensemble events
 - Festivals committee maintains that miscellaneous vocal ensembles are considered special ensembles, most of which technically allow adult conductors, but this practice is not encouraged
 - e. Rationale for classical solo event prerequisite for musical theater event
 - i. Festivals committee upholds philosophy of promoting student-centered vocal health
 - ii. Executive director encourages creating and publishing statement that summarizes organizational philosophy undergirding all festival rules
 - iii. Festivals committee should submit sample philosophy statements to WSMA
